



The AIDS Action Committee of Massachusetts

Cathedral Graduate Housing Program, a new independent HIV/AIDS housing program.

This program has 15 units for people with HIV/AIDS at the Cathedral Public Housing Development in the South End of Boston. Over the past three years, this development has undergone a complete rehabilitation, including:

- upgrading of all systems
- interior remodeling of units, including kitchens and baths.
- units available at the Cathedral development will range from one to five bedrooms.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible, all clients applying to the Cathedral Housing Program must be able to document all of the following criteria:

- **12 consecutive months** of successful housing in their current supportive housing program.
- Successful maintenance of their individual service plans in their current supportive housing program.
- Demonstrated ability, motivation and desire to move to more independent living.

All referrals must meet Boston Housing Authority eligibility criteria.
